Milwaukee Film partners with Northwestern Mutual for a Free Community Screening

MILWAUKEE – Wednesday, May 4, 2022 – Non-profit arts organization Milwaukee Film is teaming up with financial services firm Northwestern Mutual to host a free screening of the new documentary *The Loyola Project* on Tuesday, May 17, at the Oriental Theatre (2230 N Farwell Ave) at 6:30pm. Set against the backdrop of a particularly turbulent year in Civil Rights Movement history, the film reexamines the cultural impact of the 1963 Loyola Ramblers, one of the few fully an integrated men's college basketball teams of its time, whose national title run broke racial barriers ushering in a new era of equality in college basketball.
