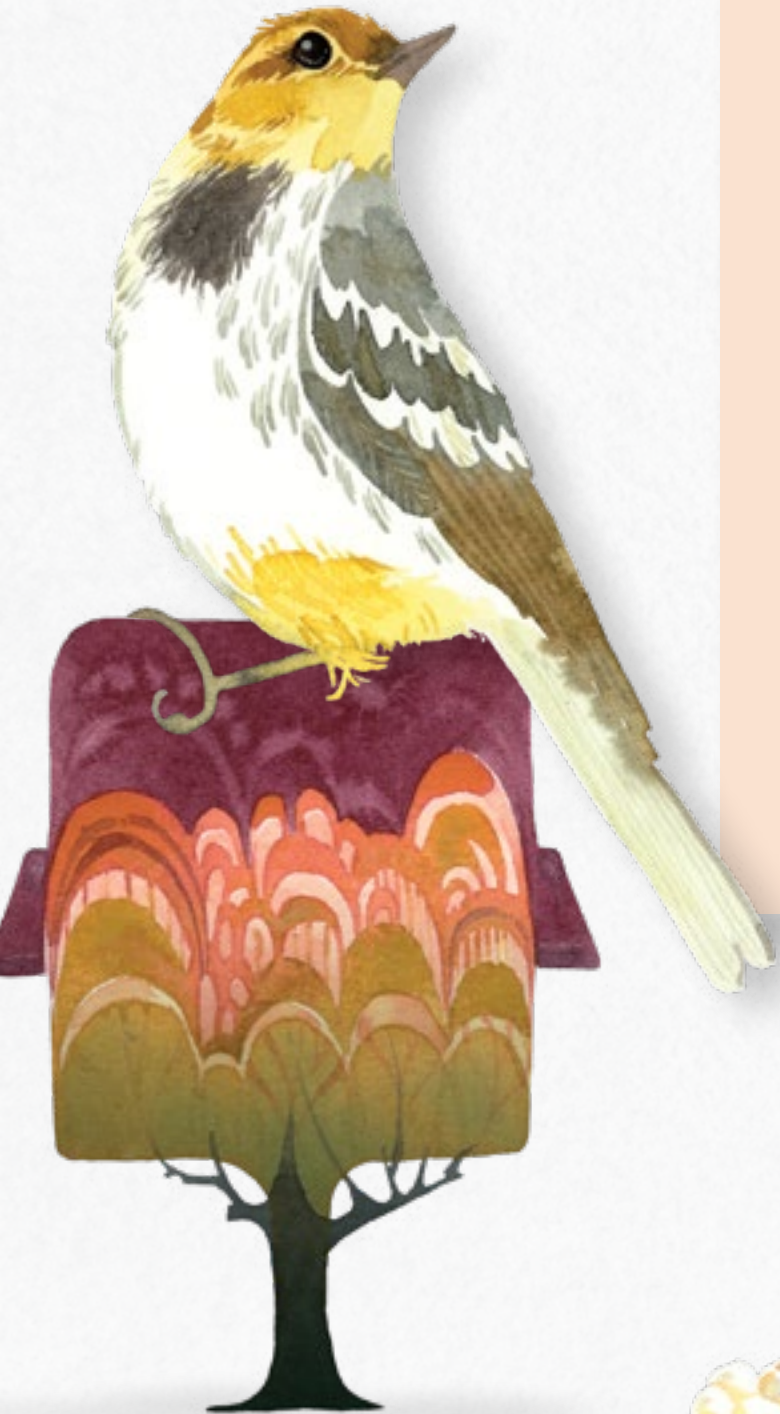

Now, on with the show!

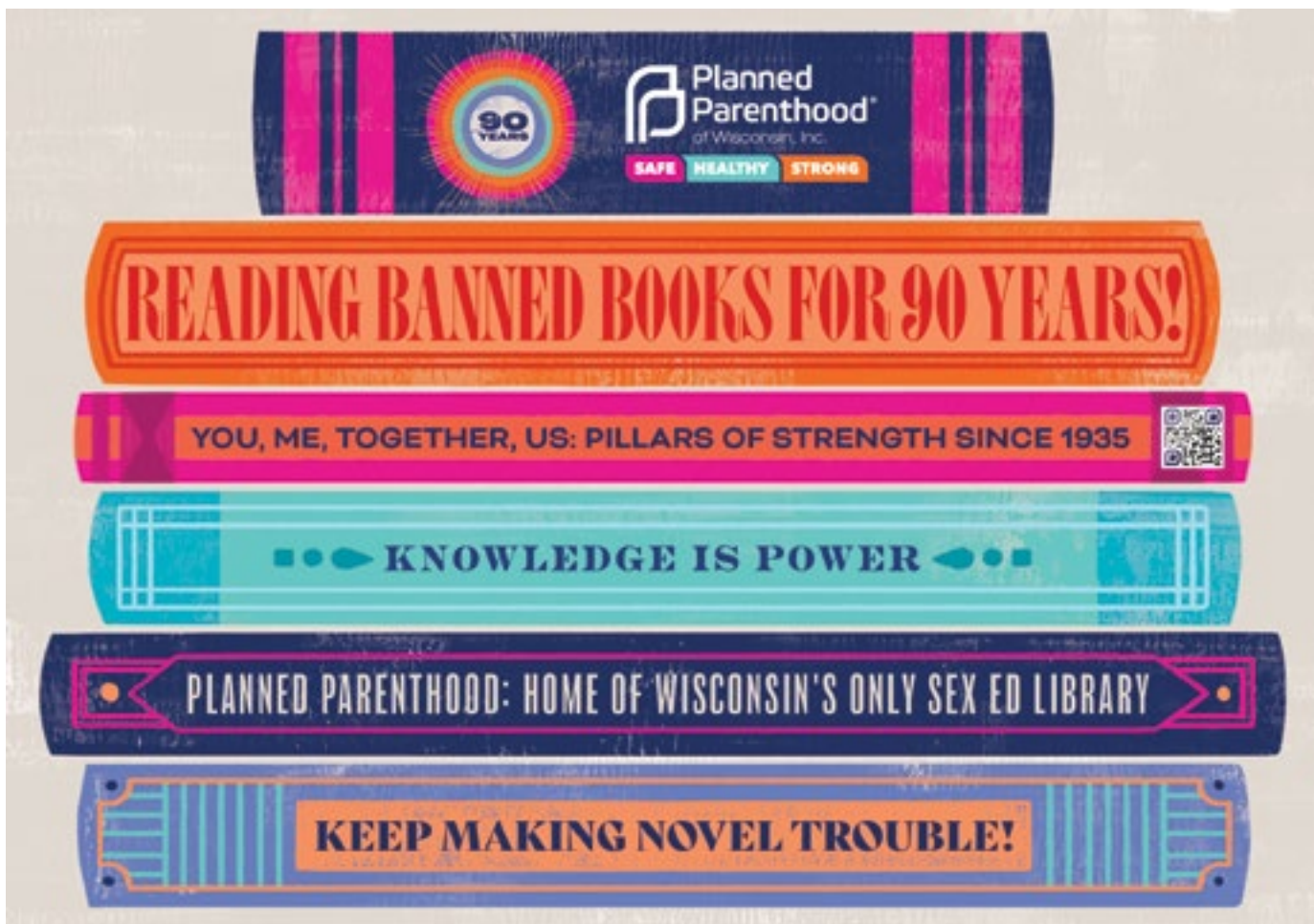

If you have an All-Access Festival Pass please arrive at the theater at least 30 minutes before showtime. You'll get to enter the theater without waiting in the ticket-holder line!

IMPORTANT NOTE To guarantee a seat for a screening, ticket and pass holders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to scheduled showtime. Ticket and pass holders arriving less than 15 minutes prior to scheduled showtime cannot be guaranteed a seat and will be seated only as capacity allows and at the discretion of Festival staff. No refunds or exchanges are available to ticket and pass holders who are refused entry after this time.



ACCESSIBILITY

All films for the Festival will have hearing-impaired device capability.

HEARING IMPAIRED (HI)

For those with hearing impairment, we will be offering HI devices. These will work for all films at the Festival. These devices allow for the user to hear the Left, Center and Right channel more clearly.

We offer multiple devices for users to access HI devices: at the Oriental Theatre, we use hearing loops to transmit HI audio tracks which can be received by users with T-Coil devices (such as certain hearing aids) or with devices we supply in house that receive the signal via a headset.

At the Downer Theatre, we supply Fidelio devices and headsets which staff will program to receive the HI track transmitted from our projection equipment.

CLOSED CAPTIONING (CCAP)

We will be offering closed captioning whenever a filmmaker/distributor has provided closed captions. When closed captions are provided, the dialogue and audio of the film will be represented on text displays for individual users to read during the film.

The devices we offer for accessing closed captioning tracks are called Captiview. These are small displays that can be mounted by the

user either in a cup holder or on a seat rest and positioned so that the captions can be read while watching the film.

Staff will need to program these devices for each film, and it should be noted that Closed Captions will only be available for the featured content (e.g. not on trailers).

Attendees should inquire with box office staff if a film will be offering closed captioning.

OPEN CAPTIONS (OCAP)

We will be offering open captions for two films: LIFE AFTER (pg. 36) and MARLEE MATLIN: NOT ALONE ANYMORE (pg. 37). For these screenings, the captions will be on the screen for everyone to see and no devices will be necessary.

VISUAL IMPAIRED (VI)

For those with visual impairments, we will be providing devices for VI tracks whenever they have been provided by the filmmaker or distributor. These audio tracks provide a narrated description of what is happening on the screen. These audio tracks are transmitted to the user via a Fidelio receiver and headset which staff will program to receive the appropriate audio track. Attendees should inquire with box office staff if a film will be offering VI.

And join us at Triple Taproom every day of the festival (hours may vary) at our Festival Lounge presented by The Yabuki Family Foundation for a drink or a bite—many of our local and visiting filmmakers will be hanging here, how about you?

FESTIVAL FAQ

WHEN SHOULD I BUY TICKETS?

You already know the answer to this one: as soon as possible! Many of our screenings sell out, leaving sad, ticket-less people. Don't be one of those. Buy your tickets early!

WHEN SHOULD I ARRIVE AT SCREENINGS?

If you have a ticket or a pass, we highly recommend you arrive a minimum of 30 minutes prior to showtime to secure your seat. All ticket and pass holders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to the scheduled showtime to guarantee a seat. Beginning 15 minutes before the show, any empty seats will be sold to patrons in the Standby line (see below).

WHAT IF A SCREENING IS SOLD OUT?

If a film is listed online as "Standby Only," there's still hope! You can join the Standby line at the venue to buy an unclaimed seat. Standby tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis, so get in line early. There's also a chance the film will be screening again during the Festival! Check your program guide for dates, times, and locations.

WHAT ARE STANDBY TICKETS?

Standby tickets are last-minute tickets to screenings where all advance tickets have been sold. If available, Standby tickets are sold within 15 minutes of showtime. All Standby tickets are sold at full price and are not subject to discounts. 6-pack and 10-pack vouchers are not redeemable for Standby tickets.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH SCREENINGS HAVE GONE TO STANDBY STATUS?

Every day at noon during the Festival, we update mkefilm.org/standby to let you know which screenings have gone to Standby Only status (and which screenings are selling quickly).

CAN I PURCHASE SAME-DAY TICKETS?

Absolutely! Same-day tickets are available at both box office locations, online, and over the phone, up until each film's showtime or until a film goes to Standby.

HOW CAN I GET A MEMBER DISCOUNT?

Milwaukee Film Members pay less for tickets, passes, concessions, and merchandise during the Festival. Throughout the year, they also get to take advantage of many other great benefits, including year-round discounts on tickets and concessions at the Oriental and Downer Theatres. If you aren't a Member yet, sign up at mkefilm.org/membership or at the Festival box office to enjoy these discounts immediately!

CAN I BRING KIDS TO THE FILM FESTIVAL?

Certainly. We're a kid-friendly Festival! However, not all films have MPAA ratings. Some movies might contain material unsuitable for children, so please use discretion when selecting films for youths. Age-appropriate films with recommendations are available in the Rated K: For Kids program.

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BIRD IS THE WORD

MFF25 artist **Jinjer Markley** took inspiration from the springtime migratory patterns of birds that can be found right here in Wisconsin!

BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLERS

Black-throated Blue Warblers typically inhabit larger tracts of hardwood and mixed hardwood-evergreen forests, particularly those with a shrubby understory.

BLUE-HEADED VIREOS

Blue-headed Vireos breed in mature boreal and montane forests of many types; migrants and wintering birds can be found in almost any forested setting, but especially those with some understory plants.

CAPE MAY WARBLERS

During their breeding season, **Cape May Warblers** can be spotted in boreal forests like spruce and balsam firs, or in a wide variety of forested and shrubby habitats during migration and in winter.

NASHVILLE WARBLERS

Nashville Warblers prefer to take residence in second-growth, open deciduous, or mixed-species forests, and areas with a coniferous component in northern Wisconsin.

WILSON'S WARBLERS

Often found in wet areas and willow thickets, **Wilson's Warblers** are fairly common migrant birds in Wisconsin, and are a species of special concern in the state.

YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS

One of the first warblers to return to Wisconsin each spring, **Yellow-rumped Warblers** normally arrive in late March to early April. They prefer a variety of habitats, including urban canopies and a mix of coniferous and deciduous forests during migration.

BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLERS

Often found in a variety of forest habitats, particularly in northern areas, **Black-throated Green Warblers** are considered a "source" or "core" species for the global population, with individuals from Wisconsin sustaining populations in other areas.

Our vision is to become America's most dynamic, well-rounded film culture institution. Fostering values of community, artistry, education, and joy, our work makes our community more empathetic and equitable for everyone.

MILWAUKEE FILM FESTIVAL (MFF)

Since 2009, the annual Milwaukee Film Festival has brought together audiences and filmmakers to celebrate the power of cinema. One of the largest film festivals in the country, MFF was recognized by Moviemaker Magazine as one of the "Coolest Film Festivals in the World." In 2019, our annual Milwaukee Film Festival attracted more than 87,000 attendees to packed cinemas and over 100,000 people joined our virtual festivals in 2020 and 2021. Post-pandemic we have offered a hybrid and now fully in-person Festival experience. Each year we continue to elevate Milwaukee's film industry and bring world-class films and filmmakers to local audiences. It's a celebration of film, arts, and culture unlike anything else in our community.

DOWNER THEATRE

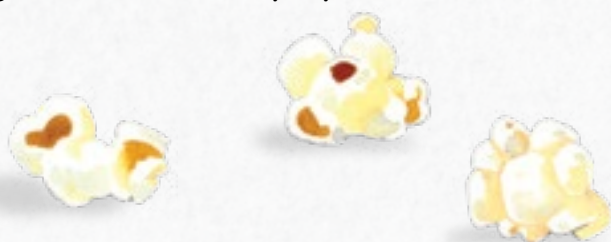
In 2024, after several months of closure after previous tenant-operators left, Milwaukee Film was proud to reopen the iconic Downer Theatre, Wisconsin's oldest still-operating movie theatre (since 1915), kicking off with the 2024 Milwaukee Film Festival and showing great new movies every day since.

ORIENTAL THEATRE

Milwaukee Film operates the historic Oriental Theatre, a magnificent movie palace recognized on the National Register of Historic Places. Since getting the keys in 2018, Milwaukee Film has worked to revitalize this one-of-a-kind space. In 2019, we fully restored one of the three houses inside the theatre, replaced the lobby concessions stand, and showed nearly 250 film titles outside MFF. After the theatre closed in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we began our next phase of renovations, working to restore much of the theatre's other two houses while also incorporating hearing loops for improved accessibility. We're re-opened and proud to show off what we've accomplished in restoring this historical gem.

COMMITMENT TO DIVERSE VOICES

Across all of our program areas, we endeavor to center the voices and representations of those who have historically been marginalized. Our programmers carefully select films in programs such as Black Lens, Cine Sin Fronteras, and GenreQueer, that offer year-round examples of that work whether during our Festivals, commemorative months, or general cinema programming. But this does not end with the named programs; seeking out the stories that matter to Milwaukee and inspiring important conversations through the power of film is at the heart of all of our work.
