MILWAUKEE FILM ANNOUNCES 2023 CULTURES & COMMUNITIES FESTIVAL PRESENTED BY THE MILWAUKEE BREWERS

MILWAUKEE – Monday, September 11th, 2023 – Milwaukee Film has announced its entire line-up of the films and events coming to the <u>2023 Cultures & Communities Festival</u>, presented by the Milwaukee Brewers.

The fifth annual Cultures & Communities Festival (CCF) will run October 5-12, 2023. Established by Milwaukee Film in 2019, this eight-day festival uses the power of storytelling to embrace cultural inclusivity, spark dialogue, and inspire attendees to celebrate their heritage and authentic selves. It will feature groundbreaking films, large-scale exhibitions, national and local performing artists, distinguished speakers, brands, and more.

The film line-up, featuring films such as the festival's Opening Night presentation of <u>The League</u>, directed by Milwaukee Film multi-alum Sam Pollard, <u>Fancy Dance</u> (dir. Erica Tremblay), presented,

fittingly, on Indigenous People's Day, and the documentary <u>Lady Buds</u> (dir Chris Russo) offers a tightly curated range of thirteen conversation-starting film programs selected collaboratively by Milwaukee Film's programming staff that explore various identities and cultural practices as well as issues which matter to intersectional communities in Milwaukee and beyond.

"This film line-up is small but mighty," noted Cara Ogburn, artistic director at Milwaukee Film. "Within it are several of our faves from festivals earlier in the year, films from new voices we've recently fallen in love with – <u>Hummingbirds</u>, as a standout for me – and new films from filmmakers our audiences already know well, like Sam Pollard and Lisa Cortés who will be back after just having visited in April with new docs" she continued.

In addition to films, the 2023 Cultures & Communities Festival will present more than 40 local events throughout Milwaukee, kicking off with an <u>Opening Night Party on</u> October 5th, hosted by DJ Spinderella from the iconic trio Salt-N-Pepa in tribute to celebrating over 50 years of Hip-Hop. Acclaimed headlining acts include actress and comedian <u>Janelle James</u> of *Abbott Elementary* at the Pabst and HBO comedian <u>Aida Rodriguez at Milwaukee Improv</u>.

The week will end with a <u>Closing Night Party</u> featuring the genre-demolishing band Gangstagrass and local music legends, Shonn Hinton & Shotgun.

Highly anticipated community events such as <u>Poetry Unplugged</u>, celebrating two decades of Milwaukee's longest-running open mic experience and spoken word collective, <u>The 7th Annual Battle of the Chef</u>s and <u>Culture By Design: A Sneaker & Streetwear Summit</u> and multifaceted expo featuring prominent designers from around the nation, pop-up exhibitions, immersive mixed-media displays, and so much more will provide audiences from all ages and backgrounds a wide array of entertainment to choose from!

"I have been trying to book a premier comedy show since we started this festival, and this year we've got two," said Geraud Blanks, Chief Innovation Officer for Milwaukee Film. "We've got a legendary Hip-Hop DJ, multiple culinary events, and one of the largest sneaker expos in the Midwest. We've got it all!"
