
# MLWAUKEEFIN

2023 Annual Report







The cinema industry in 2023 made signs of a rebound from the impacts of the pandemic, though that recovery is not yet complete and dual strikes in the latter half of the year created new headwinds. Summer saw the vibrant "Barbenheimer" phenomenon, proving that audiences will come back to cinemas (and to see film on celluloid at the Oriental Theatre). Our spring hybrid festival felt some of the energy of pre-pandemic years and our audiences returned across our programs in numbers not seen since prior to the pandemic.

The 2023 Milwaukee Film Festival kicked off the summer festival season, welcoming **29,618** in-cinema attendees, growth more than **10,000** attendees over 2022. Cultures & Communities Festival in the fall brought the summer festivities to an end and welcomed over **3,000** attendees to films and events throughout the city.

But it was the cinema that really shined - exceeding our projections and meeting 2019's high water mark for our operation of the Oriental Theatre yearround. While the recovery of our industry may be on-going, 2023 showed that cinema-going is not dead.



#### **BUILDING BACK AUDIENCES Oriental Theatre**

With the pandemic further behind us, work worked to strength our year-round cinema operations. In addition to a successful film festival, we also:

- Completed installation of a 1925 Wurlitzer Pipe Organ, which had its premiere performance in November
- Completed a successful theatrical run of *OPPENHEIMER* on 70mm
- Produced two large-scale events in partnership with Boswell Books, bringing Stacey Abrams and Ann Patchett to our audiences
- With audience growth, new offerings, and improved efficiencies, we increased our concessions sales by 67% over the previous year

With news that the Downer Theatre closed its doors in the fall, we began exploring the potential of bringing it on as a venue, while continuously working to improve the cinema-going experience for our patrons and foster stronger community connections in East Side Milwaukee.



#### **FOREGROUNDING DIVERSITY** 2023 Cultures & Communities Festival

Guided by principles of cultural inclusivity, the 2023 Cultures & Communities Festival (October 5 - 12), generously presented by the Brewers, was an eight-day convergence of films, speakers, and events designed to convene multicultural, intergenerational audiences across southeastern Wisconsin in a celebration of culture in all forms.

The film line-up, featuring films such as the festival's Opening Night presentation of *The League*, directed by Milwaukee Film multi-alum Sam Pollard, *Fancy Dance* (dir. Erica Tremblay), presented, fittingly, on Indigenous People's Day, and the documentary *Lady Buds* (dir. Chris Russo) offered a tightly curated range of thirteen conversation-starting film programs selected collaboratively by Milwaukee Film's programming staff that explore various identities and cultural practices as well as issues which matter to intersectional communities in Milwaukee and beyond.






