Important Note

To guarantee a seat, ticket and pass holders must arrive at least 15 minutes before showtime. Late arrivals may be seated only if space allows, at the discretion of Festival staff. No refunds or exchanges for late entry.

Film Accessibility

Our **cinemas lobby, restrooms, and concession stand are** all wheelchair-accessible, and all auditoriums have reserved seating for guests who use wheelchairs. In **addition**, all films for the Festival will have hearing-impaired device **capability**

Options

Hearing Impaired (HI)

For guests with hearing impairments, we offer HI (Hearing Impaired) devices. These enhance the clarity of Left, Center, and Right audio channels. At the Oriental Theatre,

HI audio is transmitted via hearing loops, compatible with T-Coil-enabled hearing aids or our in-house devices with headsets. At all other venues, we provide Fidelio devices and headsets, programmed by staff to receive the HI track from our projection system.

Closed Captioning (CCAP)

Are available when provided by the filmmaker or distributor. Captions are shown on personal Captiview devices, which can be mounted on a seat or cup holder. Staff will program devices for each film. Captions apply to the main feature only, not trailers. Ask box office staff to confirm CC availability for specific films.

Visual Impaired (VI)

For those with visual impairments, we will be providing devices for VI tracks whenever they have been provided by the filmmaker or distributor. These audio **tracks** **a narrated** description of what is happening on the screen. These audio tracks are delivered to the user via a Fidelio receiver and headset which staff will program to receive the appropriate audio track. Attendees should inquire with box office staff if a film will be offering VI.

FAQS

When should I buy tickets?

You already know the answer to this one: as soon as possible! Many of our screenings sell out, leaving sad, ticket-less people. Don't be one of those. Buy your tickets early!

When should I arrive for a screening?

If you have a ticket or a pass, we highly recommend you arrive a minimum of 30 minutes prior to showtime to secure your seat. All ticket and pass holders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to the scheduled showtime to guarantee a seat. Beginning 15 minutes before the show, any empty seats will be sold to patrons in the Standby line.

What if a screening is sold out?

If a film is listed online as "Standby Only," there's still hope! You can join the Standby line at the venue to buy an unclaimed seat. Standby tickets

are sold on a first-come, first-served basis, so get in line early. [Check your program guide for dates, times, and locations](#)

Where should I park & how can I get to the theatre?

The Oriental and Downer Theatres are located in the heart of the East Side with metered street parking and a limited number of off-street lots. We recommend arriving early enough to find a parking spot or utilizing public transportation, such as the MCTS bus system. Can I purchase same-day tickets?

Absolutely! Same-day tickets are available at the box office and online up until each film's showtime or until a film goes to standby.

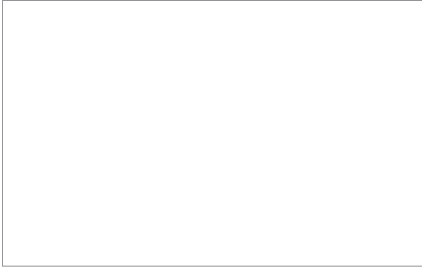
FILM INFORMATION

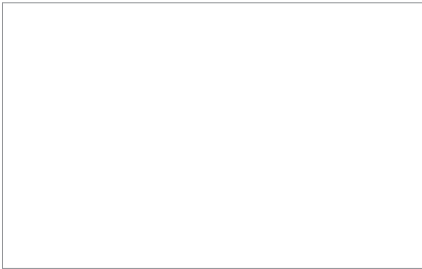
A Photographic Memory

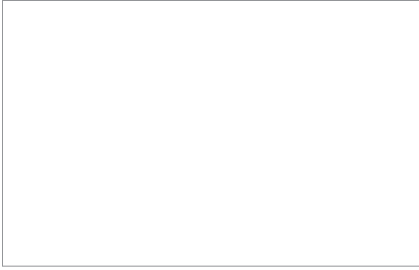
All God's Children

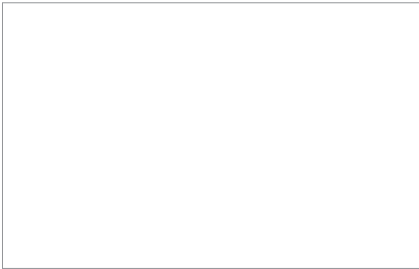
An Unquiet Mind

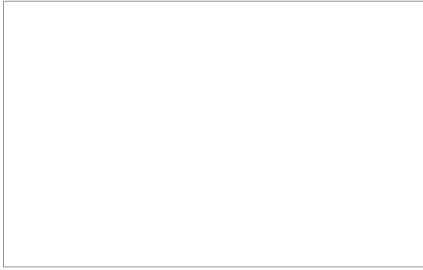

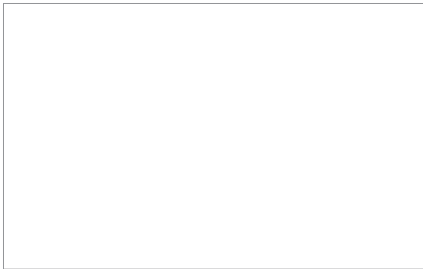
Arrest the Midwife

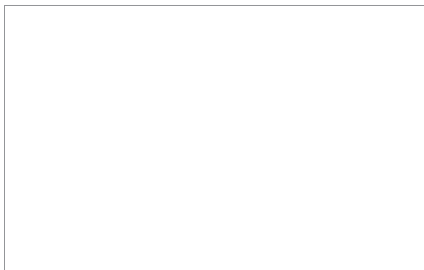
Between Goodbyes

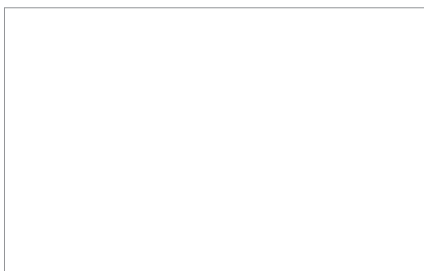

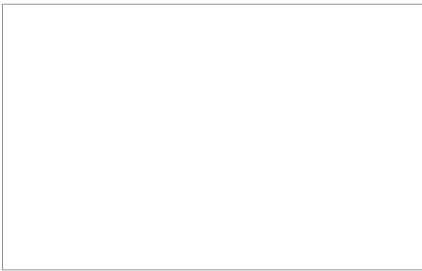

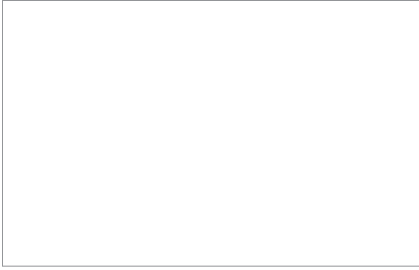
Farming While Black

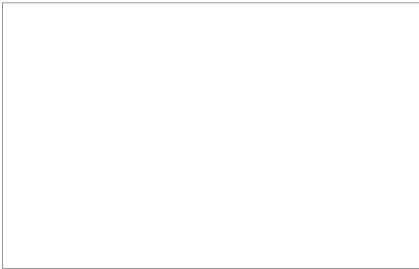
Fire in the Heartland: The Kent State Story

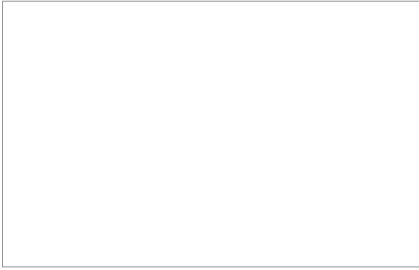
Make Peace or Die

ORIENTAL THEATRE

Milwaukee Film operates the historic Oriental Theatre, a magnificent movie palace recognized on the National Register of Historic Places. Since getting the keys in 2018, Milwaukee Film has worked to revitalize this one-of-a-kind space. In 2019, we fully restored one of the three houses inside the theatre, replaced the lobby concessions stand, and showed nearly 250 film titles outside MFF. After the theatre closed in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we began our next phase of renovations, working to restore much of the theatre's other two houses while also incorporating hearing loops for improved accessibility. We're re-opened and proud to show off what we've accomplished in restoring this historical gem.



DOWNER THEATRE

The Downer Theatre, a Milwaukee landmark since 1915, stands as one of the oldest cinemas in the United States, and the oldest running cinema in Milwaukee. Nestled in the heart of Milwaukee's vibrant East Side, this historic venue has been a beacon for film enthusiasts for over a century. Its intimate auditoriums offer a nostalgic glimpse into cinema's golden days, while its commitment to showcasing groundbreaking storytelling keeps it at the forefront of Milwaukee's cultural scene. Milwaukee Film officially took over operations of the iconic Downer Theatre in April 2024.
